Injuries on the job can leave you with no way to pay your day to day bills so paying for legal representation can seem unthinkable. Here's the good news:



So how does the lawyer get paid?

There are a few different ways your lawyer can get paid. Mainly, the fees for your claim will depend on the needs of your particular situation. Here's the basics:



<u>Settlement</u>—If the lawyer helps you to settle your claim, our fee is 20% of the settlement amount (plus reimbursement for any of our costs). This means we get paid when you do!





Hearing—We only get paid when the Commission says we get paid and the Commission will only say we get paid if we have done something for you. If you are awarded back benefits, the fee will be no more than 20% of the back benefits. If you are only awarded medical treatment, the Commission will award an attorney fee based on how hard they think we had to work to get that Award. The Commission sometimes orders the attorney fee to come out of future benefits and \$50 a week may be deducted from your check each week until it is paid.

<u>Costs</u>— Costs are the expenses associated with litigation, such as: postage, copying fees for medical records, faxes, and, sometimes, doctor conferences and depositions. In most cases, we will pay the fee up front but will ask that you reimburse the expenses eventually even if you are not awarded benefits. For this reason, we try to keep the costs as low as possible.
